FELLOWSHIP HALL CHAIR LIFT: The chair lift by the back door down to the Fellowship Hall is available for anyone who needs it. We have it inspected and licensed each year and it is in good working order. Wondering how to use it? To sit down, there is a lever on the lower left side of the chair to rotate the chair towards the parking lot door. This makes it easier to sit down and you will be able to hold the railing. After you are seated, you can rotate the seat back. On the right arm of the chair, there is a toggle switch. Push that switch to the right to go down the steps. You must hold it the entire time or the chair will stop. Once you are safely at the bottom, the chair will stop and a "horn" will sound. When you want to go back up, just push that toggle switch to the left and away you will go. An easy way to remember is to just push the switch in the direction you want to go. We have this lift to help, so please use it when needed. If you have any other questions, need help, or just want a tutorial, ask an Elder, Pastor, or Renee.
