I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.

(Ephesians 4:1-3)

They wanted to create one new country on the American continent. Their biggest fear, especially in the Federalist Papers, was that a number of countries would emerge, and America would look just like Europe.

So also, in the Church, we seek unity with one another. That unity shows itself in the calling to which each of us has been called. Each communicant member of the congregation has made the same vows before God and the congregation in Confirmation, a Profession of Faith, or even the reception by transfer from another congregation. We have all made the vows to strive for the unity of the congregation "in the bond of peace."

However, unity is not always an easy thing to maintain. Two hundred forty-eight years after the Declaration of Independence was signed, the now fifty United States seem to be anything but united as one state's laws are the exact opposite of the neighboring state. Yet, we still call ourselves the United States because we are united in the Spirit of America.

Christian unity is something so much more difficult to pin down because it has nothing to do with us. Paul reminds us that the basis of our unity is "humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love." These four virtues do not come naturally to us poor, miserable sinners. Yet, God calls us to use them all in our interactions with each other.

God calls us to this "unity of the Spirit" because it reflects the unity that resides in the Trinity. God calls us to conduct ourselves in a way that reflects Him. God humbled Himself to become man to save us. He treats us with gentleness, knowing that our sinful natures are frail. He is patient, knowing that we sometimes have to learn our lessons the hard way.

His love covers us as we struggle and stumble in our attempts to remain united. Our sins separate us from each other. His forgiveness brings us back together. As we continue to walk in His way, let us strive to show the humility, gentleness, patience and love that He shows us every day.
