THE REPORTER

The LORD is in His holy temple; Let all the earth keep silence before Him. (Habakkuk 2:20)

One of the distinctively Lutheran portions of worship is silence. There are several places within the worship service where we observe silence. Some are longer silences. Some are shorter silences. Yet they are all because we come before God's throne in worship. I covered this in the most recent video in the "What to Expect in Lutheran Worship" series on the congregation's Facebook page, but I know that not everyone is on Facebook.

The longest moment of silence is at the beginning of the Divine Service as we prepare to pray in Confession & Absolution. It is a silence for reflection on God's Word and self-examination. We pause to reflect on our unworthiness to be in God's presence. It is a long pause so that we can truly confess our sins without holding anything back.

During the Words of Institution, I speak or chant slower when we come to Jesus' words. At the end of each phrase, there is a brief moment of silence so that we can reflect that Jesus' body is really and truly in, with, and under the bread and Jesus' blood is in, with, and under the wine. Here, we receive the greatest miracle God gives to us on a regular basis.

Going into the service of Evening Prayer, there is silence between the responses in the Service of Light as the candle, which represents the light of Christ, makes its way up the aisle to the altar.

We also have a brief silence, about half as long as before Confession & Absolution, between the singing of Psalm 141 and the Psalm Prayer. It helps to center our minds as we send up our prayers as incense before God's throne.

Holy Week stresses this silence with the Stripping of the Altar on Maundy Thursday. Psalm 22 is not chanted in a rush. We take the time to reflect on our Lord's Passion and suffering for us. We leave the sanctuary in silence because of the solemnness of what we just experienced.

On Good Friday, nothing is done in a rush. The Reproaches after the sermon again bring to remembrance that our sin caused Jesus to be crucified. We reflect on where we have offended God with our sins.

With each of the Seven Words from the Cross, we learn the great love God has for us in Jesus' sacrifice on the cross. We silently extinguish the candles. We leave the service in dark silence, knowing our guilt, feeling our shame, yet waiting in the hope of the resurrection from the dead.
