THE REPORTER

When they look on Me, On Him whom they have pierced, They shall mourn for Him, As one mourns for an only child. (Zechariah 12:10)

The prophet Zechariah is known to most people as the prophet who proclaimed Jesus' Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem. We read Zechariah 9 every Palm Sunday and First Sunday in Advent.

Zechariah not only prophesies about the beginning of Holy Week. He prophesies about the end of Holy Week as well. He prophesies about the Messiah being pierced, causing great mourning among the people. Don't remember that happening? Don't remember that during the Passion? Let's refresh your memory.

And all the crowds that had assembled for this spectacle, When they saw what had taken place, Returned home beating their breasts. (Luke 23:48)

Jesus gave up His spirit. All the miracles that surrounded Jesus' death had taken place. Even to the staunchest among the Pharisees and Sadducees, this was evidence that something supernatural had just gone wrong. Everyone who had assembled on Golgotha to witness Jesus' crucifixion went home beating their breasts. They were mournful because of all that had transpired. All that they had seen with their eyes, heard with their ears, felt with their hands and feet. They could not deny the fact that something terrible had transpired. Yet, many of them continued to refuse to believe what they had seen.

How are we to focus on these verses today? How can we find comfort in Zechariah's prophecy of Jesus' piercing? We have mixed reactions. We mourn for His piercing because of our sin. However, we also rejoice because His piercing brings us salvation. We look upon the cross with hope and love because the cross is where hope and love were joined for all eternity. On the cross, the hope of all the nations was crucified. On the cross, God shows His sacrificial love for us.

Jesus' piercing brings us comfort in our own pain. He was pierced that we might mourn our sins. But He was also pierced so that we might know, for certain, that God has given us everlasting life with Him in Heaven. We have that promise now. All because Jesus was "pierced for our transgressions ... and with His wounds we are healed" (Isaiah 53:5).
