I will cause Your name to be remembered in all generations; Therefore nations will praise You forever and ever. (Psalm 45:17)

Over the last couple of months, we have heard the great praises of being "remembered in all generations." Mary proclaims it in her Magnificat (Luke 1:48). Zechariah references it for John in his Benedictus (Luke 1:76-77).

Ultimately, the name that is "remembered in all generations" is Jesus. The name that is "above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the one to come" (Ephesians 1:21).

All of us want to have that same promise given to us. We seek to leave a legacy behind us. Often, we only think about a financial legacy. Yet, there is a greatest and most lasting legacy that you can leave your family. Your spiritual legacy is the most important legacy you can leave. Often we don't even think about this in our daily life.

Physical inheritance only takes effect upon your death. Spiritual inheritance begins in the womb and is given every single day. Pregnant mothers deciding whether or not to bring their unborn children to hear the Word. As the child grows, they see how important or unimportant the faith is to their parents. Ultimately, they will follow the example given to them as children when they are grown. Their spiritual inheritance bears fruit today. God promises a great spiritual inheritance in the Close of the Commandments:

What does God say about all these commandments?

He says: "I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love Me and keep My commandments." *Exodus* 20:5-6

As 2025 begins, let us renew our commitment or begin a new commitment to hand on a faithful spiritual inheritance to our children. Let us do this by being regular in worship, Bible study, and devotions at home. The Catechism reminds us as we open to each section "as the head of the family should teach them in a simple way to his household." Remember, this spiritual legacy is not only for this world, but it is primarily for the world to come.
