OUR SAVIOR LUTHERAN CHURCH



We give thanks to You, almighty God, that You have refreshed us through this salutary gift, and we implore You that of Your mercy You would strengthen us through the same in faith toward You and in fervent love toward one another; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. (LSB p. 166)

During this Lent season, we will be focusing on *The Salutary Gift* that Jesus gives us through His body and His blood in, with, and under the bread and wine of the Lord's Supper. This theme comes from the post-Communion prayer above.

Throughout this series, we will look at the different images and metaphors from the Scriptures that highlight the blessings we receive in the Lord's Supper. Through the Scriptures and our hymns, we seek to appreciate the full range of blessings that are present when we receive this salutary gift.

But what does "salutary" mean? It's a word we use in the Communion liturgy but rarely anywhere else. Salutary means "favorable to or promoting health." Jesus gave us His Supper to promote our soul's health. Through it, He gives us the forgiveness of sins, life, and eternal salvation as the Small Catechism teaches us.

The Lord's Supper is a gift to you from our Lord Jesus Christ. He instituted it on the night He was betrayed to be done "often" in the Church until the Last Day. As part of His institution, He encourages us to examine ourselves so that we might receive His gifts for our good instead of receiving His judgment (1 Corinthians 11:28).

In His mercy, He strengthens us through His body and blood in, with, and under the bread and wine from the altar. This strength shows itself in faith toward Him and fervent love for one another. This fervent love is intense because we know that without Christ's mercy we would have no forgiveness, no everlasting life, no salvation. Also, without Christ's mercy, we would also not have communion with one another or with the "angels and archangels and with all the company of Heaven" as we proclaim in the Communion liturgy.

All that we have and receive in the Lord's Supper comes from our Lord Jesus Christ and His mercy as He gives us a foretaste of what we will receive in Heaven.
