In the February issue of the *Lutheran Witness* magazine, the articles focused on small congregations. Some of the articles from the *Lutheran Witness* have been reproduced in this newsletter. We will look at these in Adult Bible Study on May 4. These articles do not give abstract possibilities for the present and future. The articles have the testimonies of small congregations faithfully fulfilling God's mission in their community.

A small congregation has 100 or less congregants in average weekly attendance. Of the nine Missouri Synod congregations in Iroquois County, seven fall under this definition. This is not uncommon since 65-75% of LCMS congregations nationwide fall under this definition. The small congregation has been the rule in the LCMS throughout its existence.

Should we mourn this fact? Absolutely not. This fact should drive us even further into the Scriptures, where God has done some of His greatest works through small groups of people.

Gideon gathered together 32,000 warriors to deliver Israel from Midian, but God narrows it down to 300 (Judges 7). Saul was anointed king although he was "from the least of the tribes of Israel ... [and] the humblest of all the clans of the tribe of Benjamin" (1 Samuel 9:21).

In the Persian Empire, God uses Esther and Mordecai, a young woman made queen in a beauty contest and her uncle, to save the Jewish people from Haman's planned massacre.

Among the myriads of followers He had during His earthly ministry, Jesus only chose twelve Apostles. From these twelve comes everything you see in the "one holy catholic and apostolic Church" throughout the world today. There were twelve preaching on Pentecost when the Church exploded with the Baptism of three thousand people (Acts 2). According to church tradition, each of the Apostles went out to a different area to evangelize and plant the Church in accordance with Jesus' words to them at the Ascension, "You will be My witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth" (Acts 1:8).

God can—and usually does—do great things with a small group. If God had not used Gideon, Esther, Mordecai, His Apostles and many more individual and small groups, the Church would not exist today.

"Fear not, little flock," our Savior says. Even a small congregation is a great blessing for the people in the congregation as well as the community in which the congregation lives.
